TOSS OUT your makeup sponges and powder puffs, ladies!

Soon everyone will have a flawless complexion, thanks to airbrushed makeup — a revolutionary new technique for the 21st century.

"Airbrushed makeup is the cosmetic of choice for the new millennium," said Dina Ousley, president of Dinair Airbrush Makeup Systems, the industry's largest seller.

"With this technique, you can erase facial scars, blemishes and age lines as easily as a photo technician retouches an unflattering photograph."

Airbrush makeup is already being used by the cast of "Friends," heart-throb Leonardo DiCaprio,

Cameron Diaz, Cate Blanchett and Sports Illustrated models.

"To use our airbrush, you pour specially formulated makeup into an airbrush pen," said Ousley.

"Holding the pen about five inches from your face, you control the direction of the spray with your fingertips.

"As air shoots through

the wand, a fine mist of tiny dots covers your skin.

"One quick pass gives ultrasheer coverage, letting your natural skin tone show through.

"For more coverage, the makeup can be layered to cover fine wrinkles, acne, scars, discolored skin, spider veins and age spots.

"Even tattoos and skin conditions such as vitiligo, port stains, birthmarks and burns can be camouflaged with the airbrush."

Several different airbrush products are available through the Internet and in professional

makeup stores around the country.

Each system is about the size of an electric toothbrush and contains a compressor, wand, cleanser and custom-blended foundation.

The current start-up cost ranges from \$350 to \$475 with makeup refills costing from \$16 to \$22.

But experts predict the price will come down as the technology becomes more widely available.

"It's the new makeup for the millennium," said Ousley. "With the airbrush, each one of us can look like a Hollywood star!"
